In recent years, the university has lost much public confidence and some of its own sense of purpose. Its various difficulties have put it in direct competition with three other models of higher education. In this lecture, Prof. Newfield compares four futures for higher education. Using North American literary criticism as his case, he shows of these futures that only one supports professional literary and cultural study. Yet, he argues, the reverse is also true: literary and cultural scholars now need to operate in our institutions as scholar-activists, building the working conditions particularly full employment for PhDs - that allow our disciplines to address real social demands for the knowledge we produce.
